From the Mediterranean sea to Carcassonne, Corbières wines reflect the extraordinary diversity of landscapes and terroirs which compose this wide spreading appellation from the South of France. The Concertino Corbières reveals the lively scents of the nearby Mediterranean sea. It is full of charm with fresh, delicate aromas of rich fruit and spices.

Ready to drink, it is a perfect companion with Southern French cooking or grilled meats. Serve at about 17°C.
